INTRODUCTION

This policy is in place to make sure that all members of Long Melford Cricket Club understand the guidelines around using the changing rooms and showering.

SCOPE

This Policy is for all members on Long Melford Cricket club being over 18 or under 18. Male or female.

PURPOSE OF THE POLICY

This policy provides guidelines on how as a club we use our changing rooms and showers as well as visiting teams and when we are playing away games.

PROCEDURES

Long Melford Cricket Club has followed the ECB Best practice principles on Changing and Showering facilities for children in order to ensure the safety and welfare of children.

- Adults must not change, or shower, at the same time using the same facility as children.
- Adults should try to change at separate times to children during match's i.e. when padding up.
- If mixed genders need to share a changing facility, they must do so at different times.
- Due to the risks of inappropriate photography or filming, mobile phones must not be used in changing rooms.
- If children are uncomfortable changing or showering at the club, no pressure should be placed on them to do so. Suggest instead that they may change and shower at home.
- If children play for Open Age Teams, they and their parents must be informed of Long Melford Cricket clubs and the host clubs' policy on changing arrangements.

This changing and showering Policy was written following the ECB safe hands Guidelines and a selection of county cricket clubs across the country. With thanks for all their guidance and support
